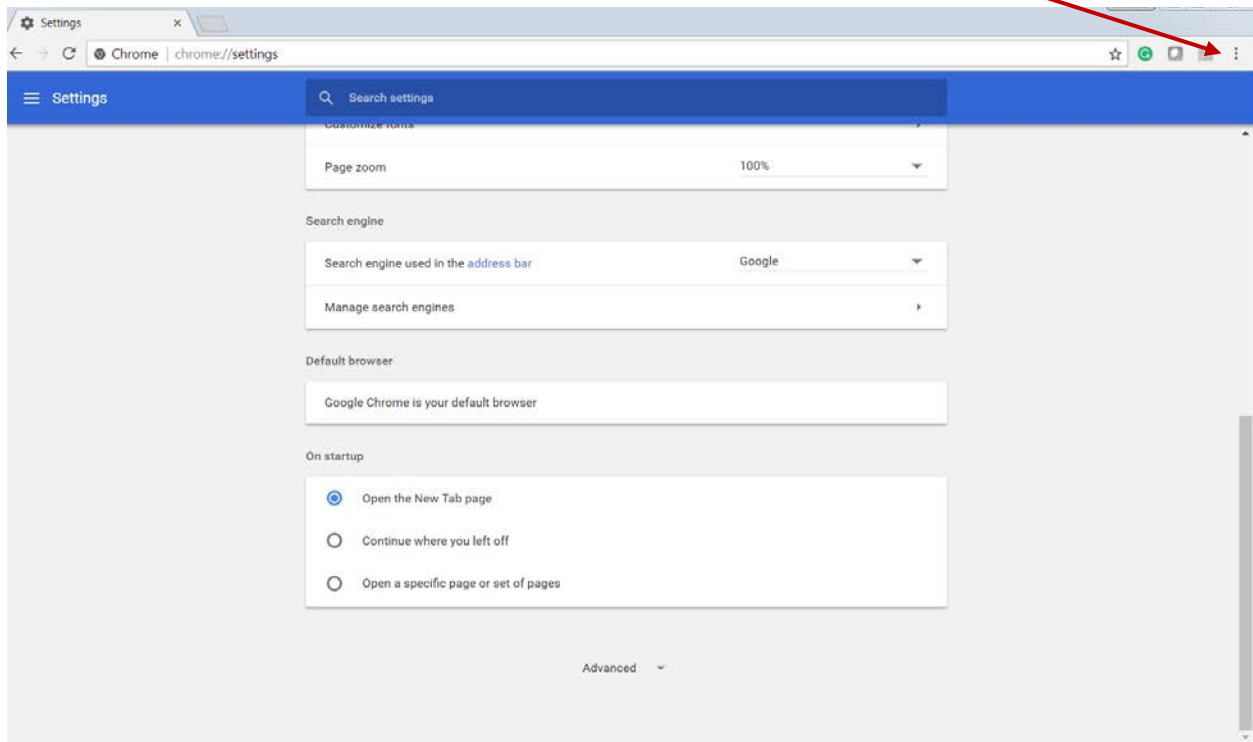
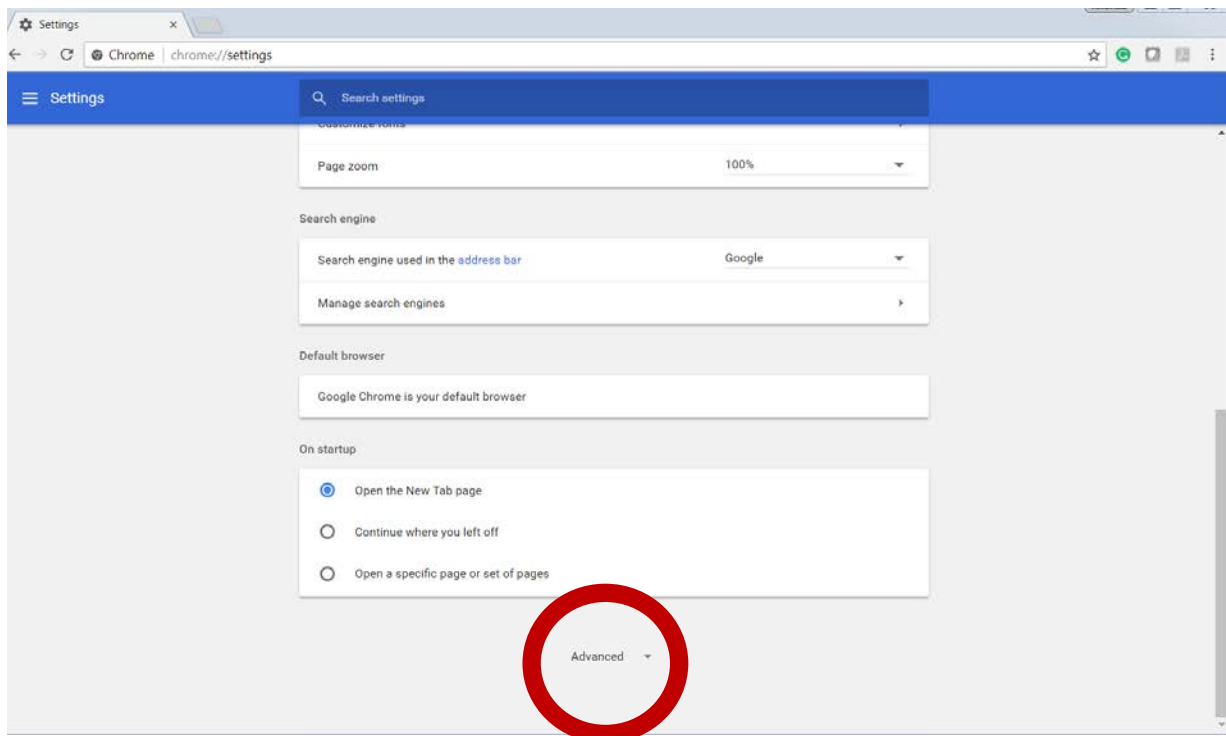


## To Enable Pop-Ups in Chrome:


Click on the ellipses on the far right hand corner of your screen as shown here:



Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the advanced drop down to expand the menu under advanced settings:



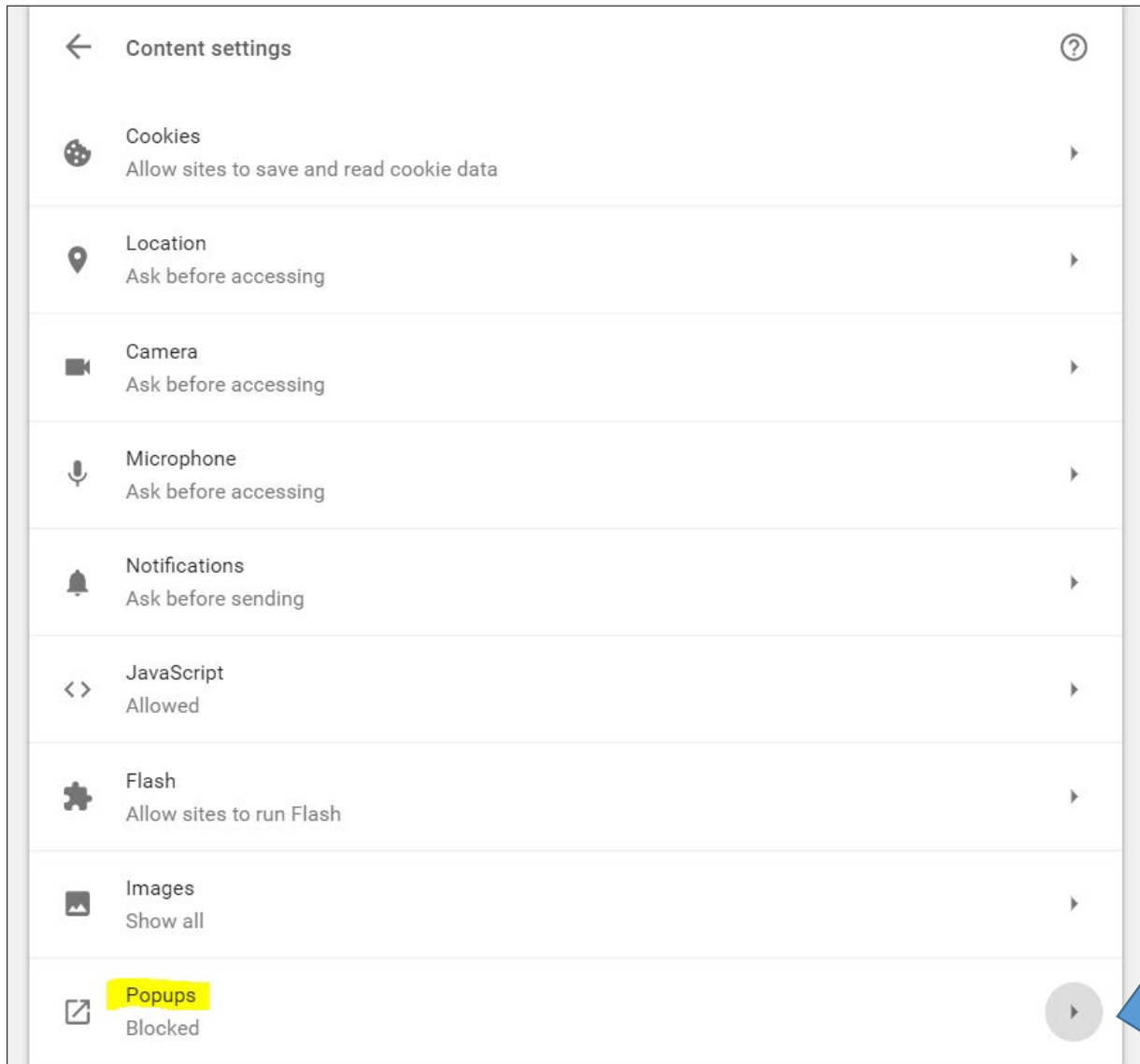
Scroll down the Page to Content Settings and click on the drop down arrow to expand the options.



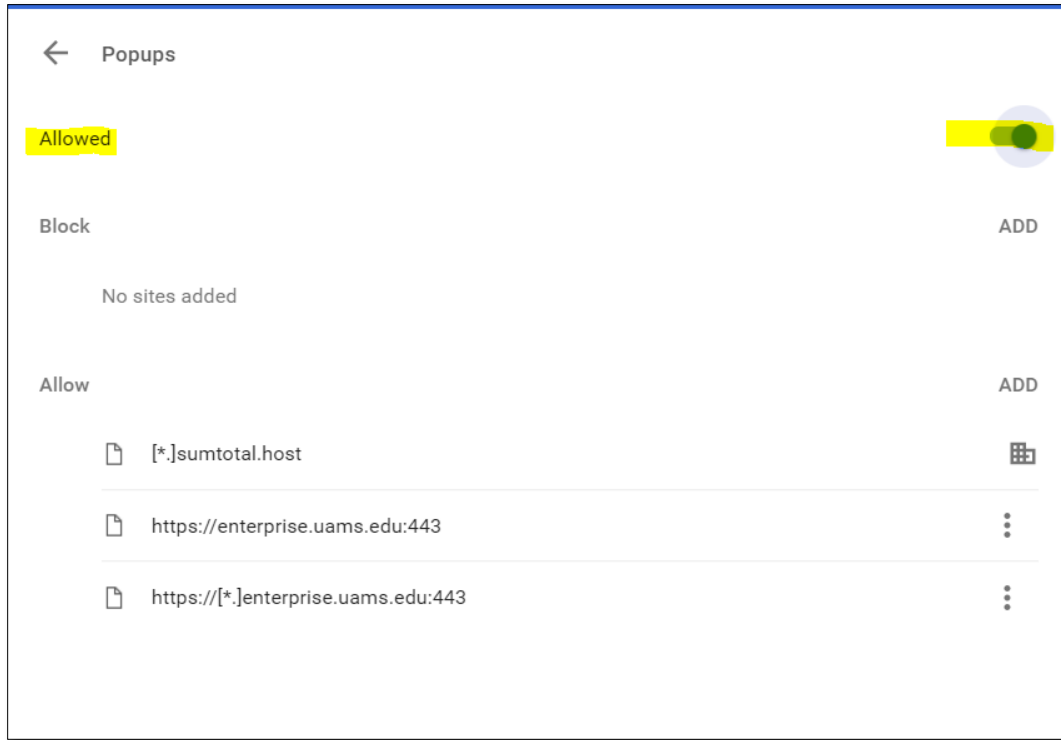

To change your pop-up setting to Allowed, click on the drop down arrow next to Pop-Ups to expand your options:
